

# SUBMISSION STANDARDS

OR HOW TO GET MORE OF WHAT YOU WANT

## OUTCOME

Students will know how and what to submit for each type of course deliverable.

## BACKGROUND

YOUR JOB IS TO MAKE IT EASY FOR THE MARKER TO GIVE YOU THE MARK THAT YOU THINK YOU DESERVE.

Consider the task of marking from the marker's point of view. There is a limited amount of time to give to assessing submissions and providing feedback. Spending time trying to figure out where the things are in a submission uses up that time. No one means to be unclear or to hide their brilliance from the marker, and by consistently following the submission standards that should happen infrequently.

Following the format will mean that the marker will see the important things in your submission easily and provide helpful feedback. Notice please the similarities in these items, as well as the differences.

## FORNEXTDAY(S)

The intention of forNextDay(s) is to provide accountability that you've worked with the lecture material to demonstrate to yourself what you know and allowed you to discover and correct what you didn't. Literally, this is a "college try" exercise. The pdf will open in the lms marking window and the marker can easily see and assess what you've submitted without leaving the marking environment.

## SUBMIT

- A single pdf document named form *LastName\_FirstName\_fND\_<n>.pdf*, containing
  - Headings if there's more than one activity
  - Your content if requested or you deem it necessary.
  - Screen shots of the code that you wrote and any terminal activity (compile, testing ...).

Copy and pasted text often puts in extra line-feeds and can be hard to read. Please don't.

- No other files should be submitted.

## LABS

Labs are intended for you to try out larger course ideas in a supported (lab colleagues, your instructor) and hands-on environment. The marker will need to see and test your code, and providing the command line activity will allow them to do this easily (file names, make targets...)

### SUBMIT

- A zip or tar/tgz file, named *LastName\_FirstName\_Lab\_<n>.<extension>*, containing:
- A pdf document with
  - Headings if there's more than one activity
  - Screen shots of the code that you wrote and any terminal activity (compile, testing...).

Copy and pasted text often puts in extra line-feeds and can be hard to read. Please don't.
- Your program files:
  - All source files, including test programs and makefile.
  - *Do not* include object (.o) files and executables. Nobody needs to see those.

## ASSIGNMENTS

Assignments expand on the concepts that you've worked on the forNextDay(s) and Labs to solve a larger and more complex problem in an independent and less time-constrained environment.

### SUBMIT

- A single zip or tar/tgz file, named *LastName\_FirstName\_A\_<n>.<extension>*, containing:
  - A pdf document with
    - Headings if there's more than one activity
    - Screen shots of the code that you wrote and any terminal activity (compile, testing...).

Because assignments typically have large code bases, please *do not* include source code in the report.

- Your program files:
  - All source files, including test programs and makefile.
  - *Do not* include object (.o) files and executables. Nobody needs to see those.
